Important Meeting Notice

Important Notice

The Council would like to highlight to you two crucial meetings coming up. On 15th April it is the Annual Towns Meeting, and then on 15th May there is the Annual Meeting of the Town Council.

Although they sound similar they are in fact very different types of meeting.

The Annual Towns Meeting, 15th April, is a significant event aimed at fostering community engagement. While attendance by the Town Mayor and Clerk is mandatory, all electors of the parish are encouraged to participate. The meeting provides a platform for residents to raise pertinent issues affecting the local area. Although the Town Council is not bound to take action, the input from residents is highly valued, often leading to subsequent follow-ups to address community concerns.

In contrast, the Annual Meeting of the Town Council, scheduled for 15th May, functions as the council's annual general meeting. This formal gathering involves the adoption of governing policies, scheduling of meetings, and allocation of responsibilities among councillors and officers. Additionally, a section for public questions allows residents to address matters outlined on the agenda

The Town Council acknowledges the potential confusion arising from the similarity in names of these two meetings. To provide clarity, residents are encouraged to seek guidance if unsure about which meeting to attend. The council emphasises the importance of community involvement and values the input of residents in shaping the town's future

As the Objectives span interrelated social, economic, spatial and environmental considerations and there are many different mechanisms that may be initiated to bring about delivery.

Committee Meeting Updates

Town Council

The Council has been drafting ambitious goals to make Houghton Regis an even better place to live and have approved a new Corporate Plan. A summary of this Plan is included within this newsletter, along with a feedback form. We would welcome your views, so please take a moment to complete and return the form. You can also find a link to this form on our website and social media pages.

The Council has also been looking at a town branding scheme to help to create a sense of place and a stronger local identity.

You'll also see in this newsletter that the Council will be launching its new website, which will make it easier to navigate and find information. The launch of the website will take place at the Annual Towns meeting on 15th April at All Saints View, so please come along for a virtual tour of the site.

Houghton Regis Partnership

The Town Partnership is exploring ways to strengthen collaboration between Houghton Regis Town Council and Central Bedfordshire Council. The Partnership also continues to seek ways to tackle inequalities in the area and to enhance the provision of health and education services. There's exciting progress on the new community and leisure centre, plus ongoing talks about facilities for seniors and those with disabilities.

Corporate Services

From IT upgrades to allowing online payments, policy reviews to investment strategies, the Corporate Services Committee continues to keep things running smoothly. There is good news for sports groups: HMRC have provided the opportunity for councils to reclaim VAT previously paid by sports clubs on sports hires. HRTC has successfully managed to reclaim this money and has passed the reclaim on to the relevant clubs.

Community Services

Updates continue to be provided on the progress of youth organisations, including the Youth Café, and on the provision of youth facilities under the Youth Investment Fund scheme. There was ongoing support for family events and those for Later Living members.

The Community Services Committee is working hard to provide activities for all. Alongside these clubs and groups, the council is continuing to provide a range of community events. The Committee also manages a community grant scheme to help groups offer various other services in the town. To date recipients in 2023/24 have included South Beds Dial a Ride, Houghton Regis Heritage Society, Keech Hospice Care and the Houghton Regis Memorial Hall.

Environment and Leisure

New gym equipment is coming to Parkside, biodiversity will be encouraged through "Houghton Regis in Bloom," and talks are beginning for upgrades to play areas. The Environment and Leisure Committee is working to make our shared spaces even better.

Planning

Feedback, objections and recommendations were given on over 46 applications since October. The Council continued to balance a sympathetic approach to the town's history whilst considering the needs of residents, businesses and ongoing development in the area.
