Wildlife Trust



There have been considerable efforts by many people to secure sufficient funding to keep the management of Houghton Regis chalk pit afloat but unfortunately no money has been forthcoming. We even have the written support of Andrew Selous MP. The housing to be built north of Houghton Regis will produce funding for the quarry in the future but the plans have been subject to many unexpected delays and it seems unlikely that houses will appear before 2018 at the earliest.

We have therefore informed St

Francis Group that we're standing back from management of the site and have produced the following statement that is on site and circulating to our volunteers and other partners and stakeholders.

"The Wildlife Trust has been managing Houghton Regis Chalk Pit on behalf of the St Francis Group since 2011, as part of a planning agreement. This arrangement came to an end on 13th April this year, and due to delays in the planning/development process, planning agreement



funds are not due to be released for some time. Unfortunately it has not been possible to find a solution to the problem of the gap in funding, and thus, with regret, the Wildlife Trust involvement in the site will temporarily cease. We remain committed to the future of the chalk pit, and will continue to work with St Francis Group during this period until a long term solution is reached, in order to ensure that the ecological interest of the reserve is well looked after. As part of this approach, we will look for eve ry opportunity to maintain the progress made by on the site over the past five years."

We are very appreciative of the support given by many of you to the Wildlife Trust and our officers on site. We are very sad to have to stand back from the quarry, albeit we hope only temporarily, but I'm sure you'll appreciate that, despite the sterling work of volunteers, the security, health and safety and conservation work does need to be appropriately funded.

The event was attended by Deputy Lord Lieutenant Maddox, the High Sheriff of Bedfordshire, the Chairman of Aylesbury Vale District Council and Town Mayor's and Deputy Mayor's from the local area, as well as ex service personnel, local uniformed organisations and representatives from local clubs, societies and charities.

After the service, Afternoon Tea was served for the guests at the Memorial Hall, by volunteers from the Right Track Community Café.

Spotlight on the Community



The SOS bus Luton started in 2010 with a vision of providing first aid support to the East of England Ambulance Service and the night-time economy. Various partners contributed towards funding the project's initial set up.

Its purpose is a first aid medical unit to respond to requests to treat patients every weekend in Luton Town Centre by offering help and support and aid to the Community wherever possible. The project is managed by the Safer Luton Partnership and run by volunteers.



How long you have you volunteered for the SOS Bus? I joined the SOS Volunteer team in 2013

How did you become a volunteer?

I became a Volunteer after someone I knew was already Volunteering for the project and asked if I would like to come along see what was involved and then decide if I would like to join the team.

What type of events do you cover?

We currently provide first aid support for all Houghton Regis Town Council events, and you will find us at the Carnival, May Fair, Fireworks night, Houghton Rocks, The Pancake race, The Easter Egg Hunt and Santa's Grotto.

We also attend and help out at many other events within Luton to include St Patrick's Day Parade. The High Town Festival, Lewsey Farm's Festival and last year we covered the WestFest Music Festival in Westoning. All volunteers enjoy attending these events as it's nice to do some daytime work as well as the usual Friday and Saturday night shifts in Luton Town.

What type of training do volunteers requires?

When you first join the SOS team, you don't need to have had any special training. All we ask is for our volunteers to give a minimum of 2 shifts a month (but you can do as many as you like). Good tea making skills and a healthy sense of humour is a bonus which helps pass the time during a night shift.

All the training that is required for the role of an SOS Volunteer will be provided and these will include: -

- First Aid Training including (Oxygen & Defibrillator Trainina)
- Managing Challenging Behaviours
- Drug and alcohol awareness training

What do you enjoy most about volunteering?

I enjoy being able to help people when they are in distress, need support or just need a cup of tea and someone to talk to. I also enjoy, spending time with the other SOS volunteers as we are a nice group of people who get along well.

Strategic Updates

HRN1 - May 2017

The Houghton Regis Development Consortium (HRDC) is continuing to progress with its plans for HRN1 and are currently working up the project strategy. This is nearly complete and our next stage of development will include design work which will enable us to submit the detailed plans required by our planning consent.

This work will ensure that the development of HRN1 is of the highest quality and is something that the whole town can be proud of.

When completed HRN1 will deliver circa 5,150 new homes varying in design, tenure and size; 130,500m2 of employment; 30,000m2 of retail to include, amongst others, a supermarket, local convenience retail and a possible garden centre; 30% of the total site (75 hectares) of new public open space incorporating wildlife corridors, wetland areas, brooks, community gardens and facilities, pedestrian and cycle routes, sports pitches along with 3 new primary schools and a new secondary school.

HRDC remains committed to keeping the community updated on our plans. Please visit the project website www.hrn1.co.uk for information and updates.

On The Road to Success

After more than two years in construction, Highways England's new M1 motorway junction 11A and A5-M1 Link road opened in May. The A5-M1 Link road is part-funded by Central Bedfordshire Council and, together with their newly-constructed new Woodside Link and Parkside Drive roads, means that drivers can now enjoy a faster and easier route around Houghton Regis and Dunstable, with less congestion and air pollution in the town centres.

These roads will also help Central Bedfordshire Council

to achieve the overall regeneration of Dunstable and Houghton Regis, creating the infrastructure that will help us to bring 7,000 much needed new homes to the area and 4,000 new jobs.

Since construction of the roads started more than 50 new deals have already been completed for industrial and distribution units across Dunstable, Houghton Regis and Leighton Buzzard, creating nearly 2,500 jobs. Overall, the investment generated or planned for the area is already worth an estimated £2 billon.

Now that the new roads are open, the process of detrunking the existing roads can also begin. The old A5 through Dunstable will become the A5183, and the A5120 will become the B5120. Central Bedfordshire Council will also start to implement a new weight limit in Houghton Regis, Dunstable, Toddington, Chalton and many local roads to stop heavy goods vehicles (HGVs) using these local roads (unless they are making deliveries). Instead HGVs will be re-routed to the new A5-M1 Link and Woodside Link roads instead.

Central Bedfordshire Council will also start an education programme with local businesses to ensure that lorry drivers understand the new weight limit restrictions. When the weight limits are in place, Central Bedfordshire Council will also increase enforcement activity to ensure that HGV drivers use the new road routes. This will include the use of additional Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) technology and extra enforcement officers to help apply the lorry restrictions.

This process involves changing a lot of signage on the local roads and the M1, which will take a few months to implement, but afterwards Houghton Regis, Dunstable and the local villages should experience lighter traffic and less pollution.



Bonney started on site in April. Planting has started with potatoes and beans, among others, in the ground!

Houghton Hall Park had a successful afternoon at the recent May Fayre, with plenty of interest and enquires from locals and new residents about the opening of the Visitor Centre.

The Aim of Houghton Regis Helpers is:

To provide to the residents of Houghton Regis, short term, occasional help such as transport, befriending, assisting with small iobs in the home such as changing light bulbs and light DIY, through local volunteers - and to encourage sustainability, self help and friendship within the local community.

Since the launch of Houghton Regis Helpers, your local Good Neighbour scheme, in 2011 our volunteers have helped over 250 local residents. In 2016 our volunteers carried out over 1300 jobs - we have given lifts to hospital and other appointments when no other transport has been available; helped clear overgrown gardens; helped people with shopping and small DIY jobs in their homes; helped with formfilling, writing letters and emails; supported residents at tribunals, visits to medical consultations and acted as advocates and advisers. Several volunteers regularly visit residents living on their own as a befriender, having a chat and a cup of tea, going on outings or reading to them.

All our volunteers have enhanced clearance with DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service), are covered by Public Liability Insurance and carry photo ID badges.


