### New Household Waste Recycling Centre now open on Thorn Turn near Houghton Regis

The new Thorn Turn Household Waste Recycling Centre (tidy tip) on Grendall Lane, Houghton Regis, LU5 6GJ opened to the

public from 9am on Monday 23 April 2018.

Central Bedfordshire Council's newly built facility features a tidy tip which will accept public and trade waste, and a highways and fleet vehicle depot for use by the council. The site will replace the existing French's Avenue tidy tip and the Brewers Hill highways depot, which are both in Dunstable.

The new site is the final part of an investment programme by the council to build or redevelop all its recycling sites within Central Bedfordshire, and follows the successful redevelopment of the Household waste recycling Centres at Ampthill, Biggleswade and Leighton Buzzard.

### Modern two-level facility makes waste disposal easier

Similar to the councils other sites, Thorn Turn will be a modern, two-level facility that allows residents to easily dispose of their waste into containers from an elevated platform. The spacious layout makes it easy, quick and convenient to use; increases safety and minimises congestion. The Thorn Turn site will also offer a 'pay by the weight' affordable trade waste and recycling service which will be open from 30 April, and later also a re-use shop on site for the public.



Councillor Budge Wells, Deputy Executive Member for Community Services at Central Bedfordshire Council, said: "This new site is a highstandard facility that will provide residents

with the opportunity to recycle a wider range of materials. Recycling does more than save precious resources: it also means that council money can be spent on other services, rather than the high cost of waste disposal. The re-use shop that will later open on site also means that unwanted good quality items can have a longer lifespan. "We would like to thank residents for being patient with us during the construction period. Moving the household waste recycling centre to its new location will help to reduce traffic in Dunstable, and this site is easier for vehicles to access."

The site is also the main highways depot for the council. It incorporates a 5,000-tonne capacity barn for storing the salt used on roads in the winter, and a vehicle maintenance workshop. The depot also houses the council's school and day care transport vehicles. Previously the vehicles were kept in 16 locations. Council highways staff moved into the new offices on 15 January 2018.

### HRN1 Update Spring 2018

During December, January and February we consulted on the Site Wide Masterplan and Site Wide Design Code for the HRN1 site. We held a series of Design Workshops and Public Exhibitions which were attended by over 800 people.

The Site Wide Masterplan identifies where all of the key elements of the scheme will be located within the site. This includes the residential and mixed use areas, major areas of green open space, the route that key infrastructure,



including the main street will take, along with landscaping and service provision.

The purpose of this Design Code is to set out clear guidance to designers and developers and to provide a design framework for CBC. It provides the specific commitments for approval that consolidate the principles established by the Outline Planning Approval from a design and place-making perspective. The intention is to ensure that the highest design quality is maintained throughout the entire development and that the vision for HRN1 is delivered.

In April we moved on to consultation on the First Area Masterplan for the site (AMP1). AMP 1 covers 114 hectares to the North of Thornhill Primary School and West of Sundon Road. AMP1 will include: up to 1050 houses, including 30 self build units; a new local centre with cafes, shops and potential healthcare provision; a new artificial grass pitch; a new two form entry primary school and green open space.

180 people attended our design workshop and exhibition events on AMP1. The Site Wide Masterplan and Design Code along with Area Masterplan 1 and the associated Design Code will shortly be submitted to CBC for determination. Once submitted CBC will run its own consultation on the Masterplan and Design Codes.

We have also submitted Advanced Infrastructure Applications to CBC. These will allow us to commence with the initial enabling works, which we hope the start by the end of the summer. These will include soil investigation, archaeological surveys and installation of drainage pipes in the south east of the site.

Queen Maisie and Princesses Lucy and Kimberley were presented with traditional floral headbands, before a special Dance to the May Queen took place around the Maypole.



During the day there was, music from Last of the Summer Ukuleles, and a magic show and balloon modelling and three sessions of Maypole Dancing, which was led by Town Mayor, Councillor Joanna Hillyard.

A variety of stalls were set up on the Village Green, which included fudge, crafts, cakes and charity stalls, and afternoon tea was served in the Village Green Pavilion by Houghton Regis Helpers. Youth Central also organised a community football match taking place, which was a big success. Other activities on the Green included 'Go Karting' and Water Zorbs, which were perfect in the sunshine, and there was food and ice cream.


