WHAT DO LOCAL COUNCILS DO?

Your local (parish and town) council has overall responsibility for the wellbeing of your local community. Their work falls into three main categories:

- Delivery of services
- Improve quality of life for residents
- Give communities a democratic voice

Local councils run numerous services, depending on the size of the council. Many you will see day-to-day, but some are less known. These include introducing solar panels, setting up dementia-friendly groups, organising community buses, creating neighbourhood plans, implementing suitable housing, establishing youth projects, managing allotments and open spaces, maintaining footpaths, public seating and litter bins.

BECOMING A LOCAL COUNCILLOR

As a local councillor you can become a voice for your community and make real change. Local councillors are the champions of their community who invest time in local projects and issues to the benefit of residents and the neighbourhood.

Local councillor responsibilities fall into three main categories:

- Decision-making
- Monitoring
- Getting involved locally

Local councillors attend to local needs of residents, local groups and businesses, make decisions on local services, collaborate with district and borough councils to adhere to local needs, and progress vital projects to invest in the future of the community.

CAN I STAND FOR ELECTION?

To stand for election to a local council you must be:

- A UK or Commonwealth citizen; or be a citizen of the Republic of Ireland; or be a citizen of another Member State of the European Union
 At least 18 years old
- An elector of the local council; or in the past 12 months occupied land or other premises in the area the local council serves (as owner or tenant); or work in the area local council serves (as your principal or only place of work); or live within three miles of the local council boundary

Houghton Regis Neighbourhood Plan

Before submitting a proposed Neighbourhood plan to the local planning authority, the plan must be subject to a Regulation 14 consultation. A Regulation 14 consultation in simple terms means consulting with anyone whose interests may be affected by the proposals contained within a neighbourhood plan and this consultation lasts for a minimum period of six weeks.

Now, some may remember this consultation took place in the Summer of 2021 however, upon reviewing the detailed comments received along with taking into account changes to planning legislation and guidance, it was decided to review the content of the Plan.

The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group, along with support from the Town Councils newly appointed Planning Consultant, have reviewed and updated all relevant polices. On the 19th December 2022, the Town Council supported the updated Plan and recommended it should be subjected to a further `light touch' Regulation 14 public consultation.

Following this meeting it was agreed that the public consultation should start on Monday 23rd January 2023 and end on Monday 6th March 2023. However, due to the lateness of the receipt of the Policies Map, which was received on the 7th February, it has been decided to extend the consultation period by a further 2 weeks. Therefore, the consultation period will now end on the 20th March 2023.

You are encouraged to revisit the plan, now that the Policies Map has been inserted, to allow you the opportunity to make any further comments.

About Houghton Regis Neighbourhood Plan

Neighbourhood Plans were introduced by the Localism Act 2011 as a way to allow local communities to identify the challenges facing their areas and to put forward potential solutions. The Steering Group presented a draft Neighbourhood Plan for public consultation in the autumn of 2021. Following that consultation, the plan has been extensively revised based on the comments received, including adding some items due to changes in the law. This revised draft is now ready for another public consultation.

This represents a statutory 6 week period of consultation in accordance with Regulation 14 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012. The 6 week consultation period will run from Monday 23rd January to Monday 6th March 2023.

Consultation date extended to the 20th March 2023

Following this consultation, the Neighbourhood Development Plan will need to be amended and then submitted to Central Bedfordshire Council, as required, for Regulation 16 consultation and following that an independent examination will be carried out. The Plan, if successful at examination, will then proceed to a local referendum to ensure that it receives local support.
