Houghton Regis Town Council -Budget 2014/15

After much deliberation the Town Council has set its budget and precept for 2014/15 and is pleased to advise residents that the precept has been set at £772,000 which will enable the Band D charge to remain the same as in 2013/14.

The budget setting process has again been difficult this year due to the ongoing repercussions of the Welfare Reforms and the withdrawal of £90,035 Support Grant from Central Bedfordshire Council. Not only has the Town Council managed to continue the services it provides but it has done so with substantially reduced funding.

ncluded in this budget is provision for the following:

- Community services to support residents and the voluntary and community sector
- Cleaning and maintenance of the put toilets in the town centre
- Additional high visibility policing.
- An ongoing programme of community events
- Provision of an Easter and Summer
 playscheme
- Contribution to funds for development of a new cemetery, an allotment site and for play area replacement.

The Council has once again maintained its commitment to provide grants to local organisations, and to the Pride of Houghton scheme.

What's going on in your town...

Co-op Site

A report was recently considered at CBC's Executive on 14th January 2014 which set out the background and current position with the Co-op.The meeting decided to:

- To delegate to the Director of Improvement and Corporate Services, in consultation with the Executive Member for Corporate Resources, the authority to agree the best terms available through mediation for the authority.
- 2. In the event that mediation is unsuccessful, delegate to the Director of Improvement and Corporate Services, in consultation with the Executive Member for Corporate Resources, the authority to begin litigation.

Woodside Link

The scheme is currently progressing well through the Development Consent Order application. The examination process is underway and is set to close on 8th April 2014. It is expected that the Examiner will deliver the report September/ October 2014. The plan then is to start work on the link in late 2014, with completion in 2016/17, when it will join up with the new junction 11A that is part of the A5-M1 scheme.

HRN 1

The Secretary of State has confirmed that he will not be calling in this application. Accordingly planning permission has effectively been granted and we await further progress.

It was a fascinating insight to the industry, very long 12hr+ days for over a month, and certainly one of the most interesting assignments I have had in recent months.
