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### **Mayor's Forward**

The past few months have been so dreary, and storms Caira, Dennis and Jorge have taken their toll. But at last, the nights are becoming shorter, and the smell of spring in the air is almost upon us.

Former Mayor Cllr Martin Kennedy has given me an unprecedented gift, for which I am both grateful and sad. You may already know that I was elected in January to serve out the remainder of the calendar year until May 2020 as Mayor of Houghton Regis. This is a great and unexpected honour for which I am grateful and I know my mum would be so chuffed, but I am sad for the circumstance with which it was granted.

Last week I was preparing for my first official event to raise funds for my two charities. I busily got to baking muffins for my Mayor's Coffee Morning, and was told that I am the first Mayor to actually bake for this event. My charities for the remainder of the year are two that are very close to my heart, but what I mostly want to do with my time as Mayor is inspire.

Shelter is the first of my charities. I have been in the situation where I have had to use their services, and I do not hide this fact. Anyone can lose their home, for a whole variety of reasons. Many of us are just one pay packet away from it at any one time. It doesn't have to be an end, and it can be overcome. I am proof that the hardships and failures that we may face along the path throughout our lives do not have to define us. It's what we do in spite of them that does.

My second charity is the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF). This is another cause that I am passionate about, and improving the education around this autoimmune condition is my goal. Juvenile Diabetes, or as it's more commonly known, Type 1 Diabetes can affect young people of any age, at any time. There is no known cause, and it is incurable. Those diagnosed are insulin dependent for the rest of their lives, there is comparatively little funding towards finding a cure, and research suggests that incidences of diagnoses are on the increase. Our children with diabetes are often subject to ridicule, and the support from government to help with managing their life long, life altering/ threatening condition has been eroded over the past ten years. I

hope you will support me with making the lives of these children a little more bearable by raising awareness, and donating to help to fund research for a cure.

I am presently preparing for a St Patrick's Day themed quiz (with a lovely Irish themed supper) at St Vincent's on Friday 20 March to raise some money for my charities, and I will be hosting an Afternoon Tea at the Bowls Club in May. The Mayor's Annual Civic Service will be held on Sunday 26 April at All Saints Church. All are welcome. This is a great opportunity for me to sing really badly, and no one will complain.

The Mayor's Office is FULL of Easter Egas ready for the Easter Ega Hunt on Saturday 4 April. The event is FREE so please be sure to join us in the library between 9am-12noon. In a slight change of schedule this year, the Town Council will be hosting a special event in place of May Day to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of VE Day. The Bank Holiday has been moved in recognition of this occasion to 8 May. Arrangements for this event are still being finalised, but at the time of writing, I can confirm that this event will be held in the Bedford Square Centre, and in the shopping centre (weather permitting), and it will include an Afternoon Tea, with a talk about Enigma by Nick Hill from the Bletchley Park Museum, stalls including the RAF Association, displays from the Houghton Regis Heritage Society, and musical entertainment. January 2020 saw Councillor Martin Kennedy stand down from his role as Town Mayor.

The Town Council meeting held on 20th January 2020 saw the election of the new Town Mayor Cllr McMahon and new Deputy Mayor Cllr Thorne for the rest of the municipal year.

Updates were provided on the fundraising events held and on the community and civic events that had been attended. Other councillors provided verbal reports from meetings they had attended on outside organisations or from training courses they had attended on behalf of the council. Of particular note was:

#### **Town Partnership**

Many issues continue to be considered at this joint meeting, ranging from environmental health matters to car parking to the provision of services.

- 2. Flag pole illumination

#### **Planning Committee**

This committee have:

- Considered 41 planning applications, some were supported, some were objected to and some were commented on
- Received updates on strategic development sites in the town and on the local plan.
- Supplied Central Bedfordshire Council with suggested themes for street names for various developments in Houghton Regis.

### **Houghton Regis Town Council - Budget 2020/21**

After much deliberation and hard work over the last few months the Town Council has set its budget and precept for 2020/21 and is able to advise residents that the precept has been set at £904,518. This representants a 2% increase in the Band D charge which equates to an increase of £3.50 per year or 7p per week.

The budget which has been set makes provision for the delivery of the projects identified within the Houghton Regis: Our Vision: Our Town (2020-20204), including:

#### **Corporate Services Committee:**

• Continued provision for central services such as accountancy and investment fees, councillor services and support, IT and communication costs, insurance, advertising and property maintenance costs along with officer salaries and training.

#### **Environment & Leisure Committee:**

 Ongoing provision has been made to manage and maintain public open spaces, sports facilities, play areas, the cemetery and All Saints churchyard;  Capital provision for projects including refurbishment of Orchard Close pavilion, 5 additional community defibrillators, and additional outdoor fitness equipment.

#### **Community Services Committee:**

- Provision for 3 family days out,
   Summer Holiday club, for the Youth
   Pop Up Cafe, for town centre toilet cleaning, for Christmas lights,
   Council communications and a community grant scheme;
- Continued provision of community events;
- Local retailer support (Shop Local Campaign and town centre events);
- Improved community safety and reduced fear of crime.

### **Houghton Regis Cemetery & Garden of Remembrance**

The Town Council has been honoured to have been able to offer residents of the Town a tranquil cemetery in which to inter loved ones and to visit them in due course. It is acknowledged that the Cemetery is a valued facility within the town and the Council are committed to ensuring this continues.

Inevitably as time has progressed the Cemetery has become increasingly occupied. In planning for the future the Town Council has sought to secure a new cemetery site through emerging planning applications and through investigations into existing areas of green open space to see if they could be converted. It was with deep regret that the Council were not successful in securing a new cemetery site within the

plans for Linmere (HRN1) and HRN2 and although hope remains that other land in proximity to these developments may come forward in due course, it cannot be guaranteed. Residents can be assured that the Council will continue to monitor and explore options as they arise in future years.

However, to meet the challenge of providing burial options within the confines of the existing cemetery the Council is pleased to announce that the new Garden of Remembrance has been laid out. As the spring comes around the Garden will flourish as the plants and trees grow. Loved ones can be laid to rest in memorial vaults with a choice of granite stone and headstone. There is also

a beautiful leaf memorial feature on which families can display a commemorative plague.

It is with deep and genuine regret that the Council had to come to the difficult decision to cease full body burials once the existing body burial space has been completed. Whilst it is acknowledged that this may present a great disappointment to some as personal burial choices may not be able to be met within a person's home town, the Council is confident that the high quality environment of the Garden of Remembrance will provide an exceptionally beautiful and tranquil space for many years to come.

### **The Houghton Regis Neighbourhood Plan**

It has been a long road to get to this point, but we are almost ready now to bring the plan out for its statutory consultation!

In recent weeks we have had some informal talks with Central Bedfordshire Council, who have given us their initial thoughts. This has been very much appreciated and has led to a few changes, particularly to one section of the plan. The advantage of doing this now is that it is a much simpler process than responding to a formal comment received during the consultation and should result in a smoother formal consultation process with the Council.

The consultation will be a minimum six-week period when various interested bodies, such as other local town councils, Central Bedfordshire Council, and environmental

groups, along with all Houghton Regis residents get to look over and comment on the draft plan. Following on from the consultation, the steering group will take that feedback and either make changes to the draft plan or document why no change was made, and then the revised plan will go to an outside expert for one more looking at before it will be put on a referendum for residents to vote on.

As of the time of writing, we are not sure of the exact dates of the consultation, but we are looking at May-July as the most likely window. For residents of Houghton Regis, the consultation will consist of an online questionnaire and several public drop-in meetings. Comments will also be welcome by mail or email. Details of all this, along with a summary of the actual proposals in the plan, will be sent in a flier to every

household in the town and there will be an active advertising campaign in various media, so everyone should have a chance to look at and comment on the plan.



From 2016 the town council has been working hard to fulfil its Vision. As this Vision comes to an end, we wanted to let you know how we have done. However the list is long, so here is the highlights only, we have...

- Helped to develop a stronger local economy which promotes local businesses through developing a Neighbourhood Plan, promoting the town centre and its retail offer, working with partners on town centre issues and through looking after local historic gems.
- Faced the challenges and maximised the opportunities of growth through further developing relationships with stakeholders, providing information and advice and looking for a new cemetery.
- Developed a safer town with a reduced fear of crime through a number of anti-crime and anti-social behaviour projects including enviro-crime reporting, street cleaning, improved parking and speed controls, more CCTV, and the emerging bulk waste removal project.
- Developed a more active, engaged and inclusive community through enhanced play equipment, outdoor exercise equipment, skate park improvements, bigger and better community events including the new Houghton Rocks and Fireworks display, youth events and opportunities, and a widereaching community grants scheme. We are also progressing a very exciting project to create a sporting hub with an all-weather pitch at Tithe Farm recreation ground.
- Built a strong, efficient and proactive Town Council through a process of reviewing and adapting structures and systems to ensure fitness for purpose and effective ways of working, maintaining our offices whilst searching for a longer term solution, developing relationships with local key partners and stakeholders and offering local apprentice opportunities.
