Mayoral News!

Hello! I'd love to take a moment to introduce myself. I'm Elaine Cooper, a Councillor for Parkside, and since May 2024, I've had the honor of serving as Mayor of Houghton Regis until May 2025. I'm incredibly proud to represent our wonderful town!

I am a mother of 4 (grown up) children. I have lived in Houghton Regis for over 20 years and I want to say, I absolutely love living here.



Prior to moving to Houghton Regis, I lived in London, where for years I volunteered, as a helper, initially, with Down Syndrome children and then also adults. I then went on to be a live-in-carer for three adults, with learning difficulties, sight and physical disabilities. I lived with them for five years, helping them with their everyday duties, travel and ultimately, independence.

When I moved to Houghton Regis, I became a Legal Consultant but then went on to be a carer for elderly people. I retired about eight years ago but felt, there were still things I could offer to the community.

As Mayor, I have two charities, that are close to my heart. The first one is, The Keech Hospice Care, which I visited earlier this year and the only way I can put it, is I was blown away by the work they do and the facilities they have, in order to make, the adults and children they care for, who are approaching their end of life, as easy and comfortable as possible and it's sad to say, that they rely heavily on charitable donations. My second charity is for, The Down Syndrome Association. On the 9th February, 2004, whilst I was viewing the house I live in now, my Daughter,

who lives in America gave birth to a down syndrome little girl. My granddaughter Kaya, is now 20 years old and she is wonderful.



I have only been Mayor for four months but already, we have raised a lot of money for the two charities and will continue to do so, until next May, when both charities will be presented with a cheque.

Houghton Regis is a great place to live, I know, we have our problems, like everywhere else in the Country but I really love living here and we have so much to look forward to. The new 3G pitches when they are up and running and as a football fan (Tottenham Hotspurs for my sins), I for one can't wait. We are also eagerly awaiting the opening of the new leisure centre. We recently, made our debut, into the Anglia in Bloom competition, in which we did really well. The results are on the website. Next year will be even better and I can't wait to see, how our Town is going to look.



I have already met many residents and I am looking forward to meeting many more and I hope, that I will do 'Our Town' proud.

Events

Since the Spring / Summer Town Crier, the Town Council has hosted a whole range of free or low-cost activities for the local community!

The events have included the Easter Egg Hunt, a Beacon Lighton for D-Day 80, Houghton Regis Carnival, The Skate Jam Event, Open Air Film Screenings, four family fun days, a coach trip, and Houghton Rocks!

There has been plenty of activities with the Youth Team, which included a sailing residential trip for the young people, (which gave them an accredited award in Practical Sailing), open access youth work i.e. the Pop Up Café, sessions at the Sandringham Hub and Houghton Regis Baptist Church, and Houghton Regis Youth Council, Boxing Sessions and Bike and Scooter Coaching. There was also a visit from the team from Sporting



Aid who put on lots of sporting activities, including sessions for the summer, alongside the Youth Workers.

The Later Living Social Group has delivered 'Tea and Treats' at All Saints View every month to retired residents, and 2 coach trips. Towards the end of the year, the group are looking forward to a trip to the pantomime in December, and a Christmas meal.

Moving forwards for the remainder of 2024, the Town Council still has plenty of events to look forward to, such as the Fireworks Display (3rd November 2024), Crafty November event (date TBC), Christmas Carol Service (7th December) and Santa's Grotto (14th December). There will also be the annual service for Remembrance Sunday on 10th November 2024 at All Saints Church (with the act of Remembrance afterwards at the Memorial Stone) and the Armistice Day Act of Remembrance at the Memorial Stone at 10.40am on Monday 11th November.

Committee Update

Town Council

Following the adoption of the Corporate Plan, Houghton Regis Town Council (HRTC) has been exploring ways to improve the town services and facilities for its residents. As part of this HRTC is looking to work with Central Bedfordshire Council to create more opportunities for local businesses, jobs, and training.

Earlier this year, HRTC took part in a Corporate Peer Challenge Review to explore ways of operating more effectively. Councillors, local businesses, and community groups came together to feedback on their perceptions of the council. The resulting report highlighted the good work that the council currently does along with some useful pointers for going forwards. HRTC has produced an action plan to take these pointers forwards. A copy of the Report and of the Action plan can be found via our website under Council Plans, Policies and Strategies

In April, HRTC launched a new, user-friendly website, designed to make it

easier for everyone to find information about local events and services. Work was also carried out on a town branding project to create a sense of civic pride and ownership. Look out for this new logo.

Cllr Elaine Cooper was welcomed as the new Town Mayor in May. Councillors and residents thanked Cllr Jimmy Carroll for his work and dedication during his time as mayor and looked forward to working with Cllr Cooper.

Council meetings are held throughout the year and residents are welcome to participate at these in person or virtually. A calendar of meetings can be found via our website under Council Committees, Meetings & Minutes.

The Houghton Regis Partnership

HRTC and Central Bedfordshire Council continue to consider ways in which the Partnership can be even more effective. The aim of the Partnership Committee is to improve services and facilities across Houghton Regis, with immediate priority being given to boosting health, wellbeing, and education.

Corporate Services

The Corporate Services Committee has been working on issues relating to staffing, policies, finances and investment in order to ensure the smooth running of HRTC.

The Committee regularly reviews its approach to its practices to ensure HRTC meets the needs of changing employment and local government legalisation.

Planning

Since February this year, over 45 applications have been considered. The Neighbourhood Plan, following a successful referendum, has been officially adopted, this plan will guide future development decisions in the town. In its decision-making process, the Committee will also take into account the objectives outlined in the Corporate Strategy, aiming to enhance the community for all residents.

The Committee has maintained its role in providing feedback to Central Bedfordshire Council on local matters, including parking and transportation issues.


