Mayoral News!

Dear Residents.

I am Michelle Herber, Councillor for Tithe Farm Ward since May 2023. Although I represent Tithe Farm, I work with residents across our town who contact me with questions or concerns. In May, I was truly honoured to be elected as Town Mayor—a privilege I never expected when I first stood for election. I am proud to represent our beautiful town and am committed to working hard on your behalf, both locally and across counties.

As Mayor, I have chosen to support three charities close to my heart:

- Hospice at Home Volunteers
- Houghton Regis Children's Centre
- Keech Hospice. These organisations have helped my family and many others during difficult times. The Children's Centre assists families facing trauma and domestic violence. Hospice at Home Volunteers provide essential services that families often cannot access elsewhere. Keech Hospice offers compassionate end-of-life care for both adults and children, making tough times more manageable.



I've lived in Houghton Regis for over 43 years, raising my three children here. Since becoming Mayor, I've raised significant funds through events and charity stalls at HRTC and Houghton Hall Park. From tombolas and cupcakes to sweets and popcorn, every effort has been dedicated to supporting these vital charities.

Our town's events have been remarkably well attended, demonstrating the strong community spirit we cherish. I

was proud to join our grounds team at the Green Flag Awards, where Houghton Regis received accolades for:

- The Village Green
- Houghton Hall Park
- Windsor Drive Recreation Ground.
- We also celebrated success at the Anglia in Bloom Awards, winning:
- 4 Gold awards
- 3 Silver Gilt awards
- 1 Silver award

Overall, Joint Category Winner for best public park for The Village Green

It was our second time entering, and we earned a Silver Gilt for the town—a testament to the dedication of our grounds team and the splendour of our floral displays, which residents have praised.

Excitingly, the Town Council has unanimously approved the development of a new multifunctional community hub, currently called Project H (our current working title). This venue will serve residents, young people, and local partners, providing a vibrant space for activities, services, and community cohesion.

I also wish to thank Paul Geary, Chairman of the IBC Employee Charity, for his generous donation to my Mayor's Appeal. As a former Vauxhall employee of 23 years, I understand how meaningful these contributions are. I am now determined to double this donation to further support my chosen charities.

Thank you to everyone who has attended events, supported my fundraising efforts, and visited my charity stalls. Your involvement truly makes a difference.

Update from Alex Mayer MP



As autumn settles in, I'm delighted to share my latest update on the changes happening locally, and what I have been doing on your behalf in Parliament.

Neighbourhood Policing: Every neighbourhood now has a named officer. This comes as part of the Government's Neighbourhood Policing Guarantee which hopes to return more visible policing to communities. Meanwhile, I'm continuing to back the Crime and Policing Bill as it makes its way through Parliament. Of particular local interest are the new powers to immediately seize dangerous off-road bikes and tackle antisocial behaviour, issues I continue to receive a lot of emails about. The Police and Crime Commissioner has welcomed these plans.

Big boost for the 42: The improved 42 bus stopping off on the High Street, Morrisons, All Saints Church and Roslyn Way is already making life easier, especially for students at Bedford College and Central Bedfordshire College travelling between Dunstable, Houghton Regis and Bedford. I also welcome the £13 million boost in local transport across Central Bedfordshire – a fourfold increase in funding. I look forward to the Council setting

out detailed plans to make the most of this Labour Government investment.

Support for families: Free childcare hours doubled from the start of the autumn term rising to 30 hours a week, helping over 2,000 local families. There is also targeted investment going into schools, including All Saints Academy, to upgrade buildings and provide tailored support. I'll soon vote for new laws to reduce the costs of school uniform by next September by capping how many branded items a school can require. I have also repeatedly pressed the Council to speed up the delivery of the much-needed new primary school in Bidwell West.

Poor mobile signal? Newer communities often face frustrating gaps in mobile coverage. I'm in discussions with mobile operators about their plans to fix black spots on new-build estates.

High Streets: There is a chance to transform long-term empty shops on Houghton Regis High Street. New government laws allow the council to insist that a shop that's been empty for 365 days in a 24-month period must be entered into a "rental auction" where businesses can bid for the lease. Now for the first time Central Beds council plan to use these powers.

Houghton Regis Bowls Club Celebrates a Remarkable 2025 Season (30th anniversary year)




Houghton Regis Bowls Club is celebrating one of its most successful seasons to date in 2025, with outstanding performances across both the men's and ladies' teams.

Cup, underlining the club's consistent excellence.

Rising talent Owen Harker added to the celebrations as one half of the Under-25 Pairs County Champions, a promising sign for the club's future.


Adding to the individual honours, Chris Dawkins was crowned the Hastings Open Singles Champion, further showcasing the depth of talent at Houghton Regis.
