








Spotlight on the Community

What kind of services do you offer?

Houghton Regis Art Town creates artistic opportunities for people living in the town.

Children and young people can take part in free weekly sessions run by trained practitioners every Tuesday during term time at Hawthorn Park Community Primary: Arts Starters (age 7- 12) meet at 4:45 – 6:15pm and Arts Leaders (age 13+) at 6:30 - 8pm. All participants are also offered the opportunity to work towards an Arts Award, a nationally recognised qualification.

During school holidays Art Town organises workshops and activities for local children, as well as the opportunity to see professional theatre performances – for free. This summer we launched Houghton Regis Hullabaloo, an arts festival for local families which included an exhibition of photography in the library, a dance performance by local school children with a professional choreographer, a live theatre performance

in Bedford Square, a graffiti arts session with a professional graffiti artist and a brand new show created by young people of Houghton Regis in partnership with Red House Court.

We also have opportunities for Houghton Regis residents to become involved in the running of Art Town as a Community Ambassador, including Arts Award training opportunities, the chance to be involved in running sessions and helping to shape the future of the project as a resident of the town.

Art Town is run by Full House Theatre, a professional theatre company based in Bedfordshire.

How long have you been going?

Art Town has been running since 2014. Full House Theatre has been going since 2001.

Who do you work with?

Art Town works with a range of arts professionals to deliver sessions including actors, choreographers, photographers, dancers, film makers, artists and designers.

We work with local organisations including Houghton Regis Town Council, Bedford Square Community Centre, Houghton Regis Library, Red House Court, Houghton Regis Helpers and local schools. We also work with Central Bedfordshire Council, and receive funding from People's Health



Trust, Big Lottery, the Frank Branston Charitable Trust and Houghton Regis Town Council to make Art Town happen.

Is there a charge for your services?

Everything offered by Art Town is free.

Relocation of recycling point in the centre of Houghton Regis

Over the summer scaffolding will be going up around the Grade II listed Red House. This will allow us to carry out a full structural survey of the property to work out what needs to be done to retain this important asset and keep it safe. Once the survey has been completed, we will be applying for Listed Building consent to undertake works to prevent further deterioration, and will use traditional materials where possible to maintain the character of the building

To ensure the security of the building moving forward, an alarm has now been fitted and



t the end of June we met with the Houghton Regis Heritage Society to talk about the future use of the building. Whilst no decision has been made we will continue to work with the Heritage Society and keep them involved in future discussions and meetings.


